



Southern Cayuga County Countryside Adventure

Morning: Country Breakfast & Small-Town Charm

Start your day in the peaceful countryside with breakfast at **Rowan's Bar & Grill**. Whether you're craving a hearty breakfast or classic comfort food, this local favorite is the perfect way to kick off your Sweet Treat Trail adventure.

After breakfast, take some time to explore charming, historical Moravia. Stop into Jennings Department Store, established in 1860. The store retains historical elements, including an antique cash register and safe, as well as a doorway where employees have recorded names and dates since the store's opening.

Just up the road is **Fillmore Glen State Park**, where cascading waterfalls, towering cliffs, and peaceful wooded trails create one of the Finger Lakes region's most scenic escapes. Wander through the gorge and discover a series of beautiful waterfalls tucked throughout the park before stopping to see a replica of President Millard Fillmore's childhood log cabin, offering a glimpse into the early life of the 13th President of the United States.

As you head out of Moravia visit **Ripley's Family Farm**, a must-stop destination for fresh dairy products and locally made treats. Be sure to try their rich chocolate milk and flavored milk selections, local favorites that have become a Sweet Treat Trail tradition.

Afternoon: Lunch, History & Heritage Along the Way

Continue your adventure with a visit to **Northville Art Center**. Browse local artwork, handmade crafts, and creative exhibits that showcase the talent and spirit of Cayuga County's arts community. Here you can enjoy a lunch of fresh baked quiche and creative coffees. Across the street is **King Ferry Corner Store**, this community-focused country store includes with a deli, bakery, and local gift shop. Pick up a locally made product as a souvenir of your visit.

Continue your journey with a stop at **Howland Stone Store Museum**, a fascinating historic site connected to abolitionist, educator, and women's rights advocate Emily Howland. Housed in a beautifully preserved 1830s stone store, the museum offers a glimpse into the region's role in social reform movements and rural life in the Finger Lakes.

Next door visit **Opendore**, a stunning historic estate once owned by the Howland family. Stroll the picturesque grounds, admire the beautiful architecture, and learn more about the family's lasting impact on education, equality, and agriculture in Cayuga County. The peaceful setting makes it the perfect stop to slow down and soak in a little local history before continuing your Sweet Treat Trail adventure.

Evening: Relax & Refuel

End your day with a relaxing dinner at one of our local wineries. Enjoy good food, friendly faces, and stunning views.
